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### STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

#### "STUDENTS RIGHT TO CANCEL"

The student has the right to cancel the enrollment agreement and obtain a refund of charges paid through attendance at the first class session, or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later.

Withdrawal may be effectuated by the student's written notice or by the student's conduct, including, but not necessarily limited to, a student's lack of attendance.

#### "REFUND POLICY"

If the student has received federal student financial aid funds, the student is entitled to a refund of moneys not paid from federal student financial aid program funds. To cancel the enrollment agreement, withdraw, and receive a refund, the student must submit in writing a request to the Chief Academic Officer and submitted in person or by post by the student.
